

Welcome to Lincoln, NH and Bones Fest XXII

We are so excited that you could join us in the White Mountains, the land of “Live Free or Die,” for a weekend of reuniting with old friends, making new ones, and playing the bones. Ever since meeting and beginning our lifelong relationship at Kenny Wolin’s Bones Fest in Alexandria, we have known that one day it would be our turn, along with Ernie & Debbie Duffy, to welcome all our friends in the bones playing community to our home in the mountains!

Both Sky and Ernie Duffy’s families have lived in the greater Lincoln area for many generations. Both of their fathers worked in the paper mill in Lincoln at various points in their lives. The mill closed down in 1971, and bricks from the abandoned building were used to construct the fireplace in Sky’s childhood home. On Saturday night we will be playing our public concert in One Love Brewery, located in part of the old mill building, demonstrating the town’s shift from industry to tourism over the past few decades.

Other stops throughout the weekend will be equally iconic, both for the region’s history and for personal sentimental value. We can’t have you leaving the White Mountains without trying some local maple syrup, so we will launch Friday morning with some pure NH sugar at Polly’s Pancake Parlor (we heard a rumor that it’s one of Steve Brown’s favorite places). Then we get to take a beautiful tram ride up Cannon Mountain where the Old Man of the Mountain resided until 2003 when he finally collapsed, but he remains today in the hearts of many and on all the state highway signs, the NH state quarter, and now on your Bones Fest XXII t-shirts! We will spend the afternoon jamming and doing workshops at Loon Mountain, a popular ski resort started by Lincoln resident and White House Chief of Staff for President Eisenhower, Sherm Adams, in the 60s to replace the failing paper mill. This is also where Sky spent a number of years working as a mechanic. We will spend Saturday at the renowned Clark’s Trading Post. Known for its trained bears, steam-powered train ride, and—most importantly—Wolf Man!!, it will be our home for the day as we spread our love (and deep and profound knowledge) of the bones with the Boy Scouts as they work to earn their Music Merit Badge.
