The Lyceum first opened in 1839 when it was the intellectual and cultural center of the area up until the Civil War. Additionally, we'll be jamming on the Pavilion Stage in front of City Hall during the Alexandria Farmers Market for a Bones-Friendly Irish Session hosted by the Ceili band, Shepherd's Pie. The Farmer's Market dates back to 1749 and is the oldest, and longest running in America.

Please join us for a quick walk to the water behind our hotel on Sunday morning at 9 as we promise to love, honor, respect and cherish one another and to always keep the Bones Playing alive in our marriage!

Directions

FROM HOTEL TO LYCEUM via Visitor's Center & Market Square City Hall:

Turn LEFT onto N. FAIRFAX for 8 blocks until you get to KING ST.

On the corner on your left is the VISITOR'S CENTER.

On your right is the MARKET SQUARE of CITY HALL (as well as underground parking off N. Fairfax).

Turn RIGHT onto KING Street for 4 blocks,

Turn LEFT onto S. WASHINGTON ST. for 1 block.

The LYCEUM will be on your right (limited free parking spaces).

FROM HOTEL to Wedding location:

Out main lobby doors.

Turn RIGHT. Next corner turn RIGHT onto FIRST ST. cross over railroad tracks/bike path.

Walk through Canal Center Plaza past the water fountains and down the steps.
